Puddletown Surgery welcomes patients from Puddletown and surrounding villages, including Tolpuddle, Affpuddle, Briantspuddle, West Stafford, Woodsford, Moreton, Tincleton, Bockhampton, Stinsford, Piddlehinton, Piddletrenthide, Alton Pancras, Plush, Dewlish, Ansty, Cheselbourne, Melcombe Bingham and Milborne St Andrew.

Our team includes three GPs, a team of Primary Care Nurses, two Health Care Assistant as well as our Dispensary, Reception and Administration staff.

We offer a full general practice service and run specialist clinics for patients with asthma, heart disease, diabetes and other long-term conditions. We offer minor injury and minor surgery services, dietary advice, continence support, family planning, maternity care, well person screening, anticoagulation monitoring, ante and post-natal care, childhood and travel immunisations and smoke stop support.

We also offer extended primary care services, including Citizens Advice here at the Surgery.

The Practice has an active Patient Participation Group which works with the Practice to continuously improve the quality of our services.

If you live more than one mile from a chemist we can supply your medicines from our Dispensary.

At Puddletown Surgery we aim to treat all our patients promptly, courteously and in complete confidence. We feel it is important you know who you are speaking to, so our Practice staff wear a name badge and identify themselves on the telephone.

Puddletown Surgery is a 'training practice'. This means that hospital doctors wanting to enter general practice spend six months or a year with us in order to gain the experience they need to become family doctors.

We will also use your information so that this practice can check and review the quality of the care we provide. This helps us to improve our services to you.

We will share relevant information from your medical record with other health or social care staff or organisations when they provide you with care. For example, your GP will share information when they refer you to a specialist in a hospital. Or your GP will send details about your prescription to your chosen pharmacy.

Clinics

Accidents and Injuries

During our opening hours the Doctors and Nurses are happy to assess injuries and give advice. We can treat most minor trauma and injuries, such as cuts and grazes.

Health Visitor – Second Thursday of the month 9.30 – 11.00 am

This clinic is run by the Health Visitor. New babies are invited for regular check-ups from eight weeks old.

Diabetes, Asthma, COPD and Coronary Heart Disease

Our Nurses offer advice and general health check-ups to patients diagnosed with diabetes, respiratory problems and heart disease.

Smoke Stop

Our Health Care Assistant gives advice and support to patients trying to give up smoking.

Health Checks

Our Nurses offer health checks to eligible adult patients. Please ask at reception if you would like an appointment.

Social Prescribing

Our social prescribing team is here to help you with non-medical issues you may be dealing with, such as loneliness, financial/housing issues, bereavement, living with a long-term health condition, carer support or mental health. If you think social prescribing could help you, please contact the surgery and ask to speak to a member of the team. Blood tests

Our Health Care Assistant and Nurses carry out blood tests in the mornings. When you attend for a test of any kind you will be told approximately how long you should expect to wait for the results. Please bear this in mind and only call the surgery after sufficient time has elapsed.

Please phone the surgery to ask for your results, you may need to discuss these with your Doctor during their regular phone-in times; 8.30 - 9.00 am daily and 3.30 - 4.00 pm (excluding Saturdays).

Please note that we do have a strict policy regarding confidentiality and data protection. In this respect we will only give out results to the person they relate to unless that person has given prior permission for their release or if they are not capable of understanding them.

Home visits

If you are housebound, too ill to come to the surgery or a carer struggling to leave your cared for person a Doctor may visit you at home.

Please ring to request a home visit before 10.00am (emergencies excepted).

You may be asked for some information about your problem: this is so we can arrange our visits in order of priority.
